Stage 4 Open Up Idaho Details

Public Release Statement:

Effective Stage 4 of Open Up Idaho, Canyon County Parks camping and restrooms are open. The Visitor Center and Crossroads Museum at Celebration Park are open with some restrictions to capacities in order to adhere to social distancing protocols for the safety of staff and visitors.

Programs:

- Only activities where appropriate physical distancing and precautionary measures can be observed will be scheduled or provided. These will be evaluated on a case-by-case situation in order to protect staff and visitors and prevent the spread of disease.

Camping:

- Camping is open at Celebration Park and Martins Landing. Fees apply.

Other Facilities:

- Restrooms at Celebration Park will open for day and night use.
- **The Visitor Center and Crossroads Museum will open to the public Celebration Park.**
 - **Due to the small nature of the Visitor Center, we will limit the number of people to up to 5 people or one family group at a time.**
 - **Crossroads Museum will be limited to up to 15 people or 3 family groups at a time while social distancing.**
- Restrooms and facilities are open and available at: Lake Lowell Park, Lower Dam Recreation Area, Jubilee Park, George Nourse Gun Range, Ward Memorial, Wilson Ponds, Martins Landing. Boating is available at Lake Lowell. Signage encouraging continued social distancing will remain posted.
