**Stage 2 Stay Healthy Order Details**

**Public Release Statement:**

**Effective Stage 2 Stay Healthy Order (11/14/2020) Celebration Park is currently open for camping and day-use. Other Canyon County Parks locations, as usual, are open for day-use. The Visitor Center and Crossroads Museum at Celebration Park are open with face mask and physical distancing requirements, as well as limited capacity, in order to ensure the safety of staff and visitors.**

Programs:

- Formal educational programs and field trips will be offered virtually only (effective 11/14/2020) in order to protect staff and visitors and prevent the spread of disease.
- Outdoor tours for groups of less than 10 people (including Parks staff) may be offered at Celebration Park, but masks and physical distancing of at least 6 feet will be required for staff and participants. These tours will be offered at the discretion of Parks staff.
- We are currently unable to offer atlatl range programming at Celebration Park due to health and safety concerns.

Camping:

- Camping remains open at Celebration Park. Physical distancing between groups and people not in your immediate household is required.

Other Facilities:

- Due to the small nature of the Celebration Park Visitor Center, we will limit the number of people allowed inside to up to 5 people at a time (including Parks staff) inside the building.
- The Crossroads Museum at Celebration Park will be limited to up to 10 people at a time (including Parks staff) inside the building.
- Masks and distancing are required within Canyon County Parks administrative offices, as well as within the Crossroads Museum and Visitor Center at Celebration Park.
- Masks and distancing are required for participation in outdoor interpretive tours at Celebration Park.
